Did you know we have a school milk scheme?

Milk is excellent for hydration, supporting brain function (including concentration, memory and creativity) and contains essential nutrients including calcium, proteins and vitamins to help children grow healthy and strong.

Every child in the UK is entitled to FREE school milk until their fifth birthday. If your child is over five years you can apply for subsidised milk so they don't need to miss out.

Children receive a serving of fresh, chilled milk, delivered to their classroom on a daily basis.
